Contractor Criteria

The signed statement supplied on this website is required from the Contractor regarding observance of workplace safety rules by the Contractor and contractor's employees.

The contractor must submit detailed work method statements.

The contractor must supply relevant license details.

Minimum acceptable levels of insurance and copies of certificates for that insurance must be submitted for Public Liability and Worker's Compensation.

A "Hot Work" permit system must be submitted if the contractor is to perform welding, cutting or any other operations involving ignition sources.

The Contractor will be informed of any hazardous materials and substances used or stored in the work place

The Contractor is to provide health and safety information about any hazardous substances/materials they intend using at your workplace.

The contractor is to demonstrate a lockout, tag out system for electrical work.

The contractor must supply relevant evidence of **confined spaces training** should their work require them to enter these areas onsite

The Contractor is to provide safe operating instructions/ procedures for all hazardous works which may include any of the following:

- construction/demolition;
- excavation;
- spray painting;

- abrasive blasting;
- compressed air work;
- explosive powered tools;
- working on conveyors or hoists,
- operating hoists;
- installing/working on scaffolding
- working on elevated work platforms.
- working in confined spaces

The Contractor is to provide personal protective equipment/clothing for all their employees and has an obligation to enforce compliance.

The Contractor to advise all their employees they must observe the workplace **no smoking** rule.

The Contractor must report all accidents and/or dangerous occurrences involving contractors.
